Short Term Rentals: Get Involved

Interested in Short Term Rentals? Opportunities to learn more and get involved include an open house on Monday, Sept. 23, and serving on the Short Term Rental Task Force.

Short Term Rentals (STRs) are rentals of housing units for 30 days or less, often offered through web hosting platforms such as Airbnb or VRBO. STRs can be a room or rooms in a dwelling unit or a whole unit that is rented for a specified period of time.

An open house on Short Term Rentals will be held from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m. Monday, Sept. 23, at the Seymour Senior Center (Ashe and Birch Rooms), 2551 Homestead Road. Learn about short term rentals and the Town's next steps to regulate them.

The Town of Chapel Hill is accepting applications through Sept. 24 for a Short Term Rental Task Force to make recommendations to the Town Council on local regulations. Apply at townofchapelhill.org/boards.

Improving Emergency Communications

The Town of Chapel Hill received a grant from the Duke Energy Foundation to improve multilingual emergency communications. Grant funds will be used to produce critical safety messages in Chapel Hill's most common languages other than English, including Spanish, Burmese, Karen and Mandarin Chinese.

Chapel Hill is becoming increasingly diverse. According to the latest Census, 16 percent of Chapel Hill's population is born outside of the U.S. Many immigrant and refugee residents identified language as a key strategy for the Town to more effectively reach them.

The grant funds will be used to develop a cache of emergency messages – including "do not drink the water," "hurricane warning," and "flood warning."
